# The Musée des Arts Décoratifs announces record attendance in 2024 with nearly 800,000 visitors in France and 700,000 beyond its walls



With **783,176 visitors** in 2024, the Musée des Arts Décoratifs and the Musée Nissim de Camondo have achieved an exceptional year. This is the institution's second-best performance in terms of museum attendance, despite the temporary closure of the Musée Nissim de Camondo since August 4, 2024 for renovation work.

For the first time, exhibitions organized by the institution outside its own walls attracted nearly **700,000 visitors**. This includes approximately 500,000 visitors to "Beauty Speaks for Itself" at the National Palace Museum in Taipei and nearly **93,000 visitors** to "The Adorned Body" at the Hong Kong Palace Museum. These exhibitions featured works from the museum's collections.

This success is mainly due to a program of major exhibitions that have generated great enthusiasm and enhanced the institution's reputation in France and internationally. The exhibition "Iris van Herpen, Sculpting the Senses" was a major event, attracting

more than **370,000 visitors**. **"The Birth of Department Stores"**, based mainly on the Museum's collections, attracted more than **176,000 visitors**, and **"Fashion and Sport"** attracted almost **300,000 visitors**.

With projects such as "Fashion, Jewelry,
Design Exhibit", the modern and contemporary
galleries saw a significant increase in visitors,
while the annual exhibition dedicated
to drawings, this year featuring the sculptor
and draughtsman Henry Cros, showcased the
museum's treasures.

The richness and diversity of the program also contributed to this success, highlighting the unique photography collections through exhibitions such as "La Maison pour Tous" and "Japan in Color".
